Scam

There have been a number of Hounslow Borough residents who have been contacted by telephone by persons stating that they are owed rebates for overpaid Council tax. The callers are interested in obtaining bank details or return calls using premium rate telephone numbers. These are SCAM calls and should be ignored. Government organisations would only contact you in writing. Never give personal details to people you have not contacted yourself.

Non Emergency Calls

From Wednesday June the first, "101" will be the new non-emergency contact telephone number for the Metropolitan Police Service.

The move from the existing 0300 number to "101" on the 1st of June means the MPS will be one of the first police forces in the country to adopt the number.

By 2012 all police forces in England and Wales will have introduced "101" as their main contact number. Please use "999" for emergency calls and "101" for non-emergency calls.

MYSTERY OF THE ROAD MARKINGS SOLVED

Many residents have been fascinated by the multi-coloured hieroglyphics that have appeared on roads throughout the area. Indeed at our recent AGM a question was raised which Cllr Peter Carey undertook to investigate.

Good to his word Cllr Carey made inquiries with the Environment Department which was as mystified as we were.

The Council was able to confirm that utility companies are required to notify the local authority of any planned works that involve digging up roads. No such notification had been given. As a direct result of Cllr Carey's inquiries the Department contacted the major utility companies to enquire whether one of them had undertaken the markings. If so, what type of work was proposed, the duration and proposed start date.

Subsequently Scottish and Southern Electricity Company responded to say it is proposing to lay 3No 66kv cable between their substation in Osterley Road and Bridge Road. No start date was given but when the Council receives further information we will be informed.

So many thanks to Cllr Carey for his help in getting an answer for us and watch this space.
