Keep Osterley Green

Keep Osterley Green is a rapidly growing group of residents. The group was formed in response to the proposal to build a school for 1400 pupils on the site of the old White Lodge/Conquest Club. It is becoming clear that the overwhelming majority of residents are strongly opposed to this development and believe it to be contrary to planning guidelines both for Hounslow and for London as a whole.

The Council's approval of the application to build a Nishkam School for 1400 children on the White Lodge site in Osterley is now the subject of a Judicial Review. An Osterley resident has submitted a complaint about the procedure by which the decision was reached and a judge will consider this complaint on 5th July. Stage 1 of the Review will be held on 5th July. If the judge rules that the complaint merits full consideration then stage 2 of the hearing will be held on 6th July.

Chief Superintendent Raj Kohli



Your committee were pleased to be joined at a recent meeting by Chief Superintendent Raj Kohli, Borough Commander.

Following an introduction and questions put to the Committee, it was revealed that our own perception of crime across the Borough is grossly exaggerated. In fact, crime levels for all activities are extremely low with an average of: burglaries 4 per day, assaults 7-8 per day, daily thefts from motor vehicles giving by far the highest figures. On average a maximum of 24 per day over all crimes covering approx. 300,000 households.

An explanation of the finances and future plans for policing were given with an emphasis on domestic abuse, child sexual abuse, mental health and young people. The Police would like to encourage young people to join them as volunteers. This would provide good experience in dealing with people and a useful addition to a CV.
