Did You Know?

YOU CAN GET FREE TREES

Get two free trees for your garden to help make London greener and wilder. The Mayor of London is working with the Woodland Trust and Sainsbury's to give away 24,000 free trees by ballot to Londoners.

Take your first step towards making your neighbourhood a little bit greener, by applying for a pack of saplings today.

The trees have been specially chosen to fit perfectly in a London garden. They'll do a great job of brightening up a neighbourhood – and helping to improve its air quality, making it a healthier, greener place to live.

What type of trees will be provided - are they right for my garden?

The trees are field maple or birch – beautiful garden species that are great for wildlife and easy to plant. The saplings will be between 20-40 cm high and the trees can be kept fairly small. Their spectacular autumn colours will look great in your garden. The trees come in packs of two – so you can plant one and give one to a friend.

How does the ballot work?

You'll need to apply by 5 November. Then you'll be entered into a London-wide ballot to win one of the tree packs. The winning entries will be selected at random from all Londoners that apply.

If I'm successful, what happens next?

If your name is drawn, your pack of two saplings will be sent to you by the end of November. When they arrive, it will be right in the middle of planting season – and you'll be able to join thousands of Londoners planting trees in neighbourhoods across London during our city-wide planting weekend on 1 and 2 December. All you'll need is a spade!

Crime Prevention Advice

Autumn is the peak time for break-ins and associated Anti-Social Behaviour. As the clocks go back, the longer dark nights create more cover for burglars and other nocturnal criminals, enabling them to ply their trade out of the glare of daylight.

This is the reason the Police make such a special effort at this time of year to nip this activity in the bud.

They mount special patrols in areas known for Anti-Social Behaviour and Burglary, and they ask you to ensure you take your own precautions. While you're out enjoying yourself, even enjoying the fireworks in your own garden, make sure your house is secure.

- All external doors should be protected by a mortice lock.
- All windows, both upstairs and downstairs, should be fitted with at least one appropriate lock, especially Victorian sash windows.
- Your house should look lived in, even when you're out. Close the curtains and leave a light on.
- Outbuildings should be secured with a weatherproof padlock.
- When you leave your car, ensure you lock it and take everything with you.
- Do not use your mobile phone in the street without being aware of your surroundings.

Have fun and enjoy yourself this Autumn, but ensure that you keep your wits about you while taking sensible and necessary precautions.
