

Going Nuts in the Drive

Some years ago the LBH decided to replace our old cherry and hawthorn trees with sweet chestnuts which produce an inordinate number of large sticky fruits containing multiple nuts. These fall in copious amounts making walking on the pavement hazardous and they clog the gullies and drains.

Several residents reported this to LBH via their FixMyStreet page which resulted in a mechanical sweeper arriving which couldn't deal with the pavement and only swept around the parked cars.

Contact was made with Cllr Pritam Grewal and thanks to his intervention the situation has been resolved for the time being. Men with brooms appeared and reached the parts that the mechanical sweeper couldn't. They did a great job.

We trust that Hounslow Highways will continue to monitor the situation as there are still lots of fruits on the trees ready to fall and recreate the problem.
