## Police Street Briefing

When: Thursday 15th October 1600 - 1700 hrs

Where: At the junction of Spencer Road with Burlington Road

Please try to attend to share your thoughts, worries and concerns with your local Police Officers.

## Attempted Robbery - Burlington Road

Concerns have been expressed following the incident on Monday 29th June to a report of an attempted robbery on Burlington Road, TW7.

An unknown man approached the victim on a bicycle, produced a knife and demanded the victim hand over his phone and money. During a struggle, the victim suffered a knife wound to his hand. The suspect fled on the e-bike.

Officers attended with the London Ambulance Service. The victim, a man in his 20s, was treated at the scene for the wound to his hand. He was taken to hospital, where his injuries were confirmed as neither life-threatening nor life-changing.

Anyone with information is asked to call police on 101, quoting CAD 3147/29JUN26, or Crimestoppers, anonymously, on 0800 555 111.

## Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) - Spencer Road

Residents have observed what they believe to be incidents of apparent drug dealing in Spencer Road. This has been reported and as a result the police have increased targeted patrols in the area.

## North Drive Alleyway - Fence Installed

Over the past few years, the police have been trying to improve North Drive Alleyway due to it being a known ASB hotspot.

They have been working closely with the council to tackle these problems. One main issue was the fence line being damaged and allowing ASB to occur as well as the fly tipping. During this work they identified that the land was owned by three different companies.

TfL was identified as one owner and when contacted installed fencing straight away.

However, the council issued a Community Protection Warning (CPW) to the two other companies stating they could be fined and it could be escalated to a Community Protection Notice (CPN) being issued. This resulted in one company acting on this and have done their part and installed a new fence line along their border. The police will carry on working closely with the council to help improve this alleyway for our residents & other members of the public.

# THE GREEN, SPENCER ROAD

Residents may be aware of recent disturbing activity on The Green, Spencer Road.

Assurance was sought from LB Hounslow regarding the status of the land and if any applications either to change this or seeking planning permission had been made.

We are pleased to report that Sabeel Khan, Assistant Director for Transport and Parking, was able to confirm the following. 'The land in question is adopted highway and remains as highway maintainable at public expense in accordance with the Highways Act 1980.

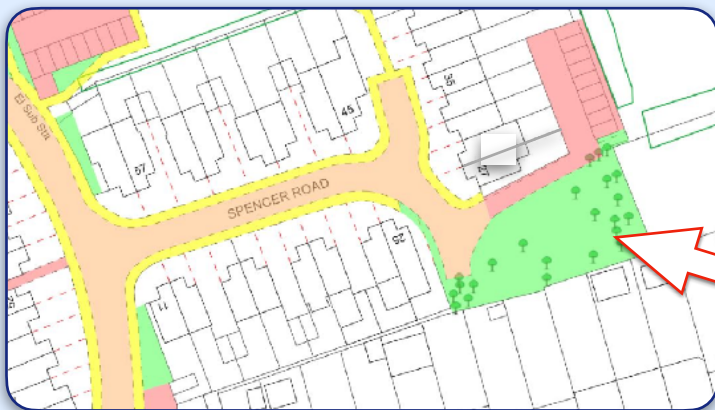
'We have not received a request to Stop Up this area and would not entertain a Stopping Up request for this area. 'I can confirm that the Highways Register (both internal and publicly available) has not changed and nor have we had a request to change this. I will continue some investigative work and if I find any further information I will share with this email group.

'Further to our correspondence, Hounslow Highways management have formally acknowledged the receipt of my email to them about this suspicious activity by surveyors.

'They have instructed Inspectors to keep an eye out on the green of Spencer Road when working nearby.

'We and I appreciate your local intelligence about this. We do rely on residents informing us about activity as, although we work across the borough, we can't be everywhere at the same time, so information like this is vital for us – and I thank you, again, for bringing this to our attention.'

Subsequently we were advised by Kevin Greening, Arboriculture Officer that there are two tree preservation orders on this site. One covering a large number of the trees located there, 24 single trees and three group orders covering land bordering the wider site.
